student self-administration

At the University of Göttingen, the students manage themselves, just like all other members of the university, i.e. they elect representatives on different levels, collect contributions, manage them and make decisions about expenditures, self-imposed rules, as well as about demands to politics and other committees of the university.

The subject group

Every student belongs to a subject, a student council and the student body. The representatives for your subject are organized in your subject group (FG), e.g. FG Politics or FG Biology. They take care of e.g. concrete problems during exams, often know the teachers of the subject personally and have a small budget with which they can organize barbecues or other events. Only one person is elected as spokesperson for the department.

All the others there just get involved. Some subjects do not have an active subject group because there is only one subject at the faculty or because there is no one (mostly in small subjects). In such a case, you can turn to your student council with all your concerns (more about that in a moment) or, if you feel like it, simply run for speaker yourself and make sure that there is direct representation again.

The Fachschaft (FS) is the representation for all students of a faculty, e.g. chemistry or medicine. The official tasks are taken over by the Fachschaftsrat (FSR), although there are also many people who are involved without holding an office. The members of the Fachschaftsrat are elected by the Fachschaftsparlament (FSP), whose composition you decide on once a year during the university elections. The tasks of the Fachschaft are similar to those of the Fachgruppe, but cover topics that affect the entire faculty. Its size enables it to exert even more influence on examination regulations and faculty processes and to organize even larger events, e.g. as part of the O-week. In addition, representatives of all student councils meet regularly in the Student Council Assembly (FSRV) to share their experiences and take a joint position on important issues.

The AStA (short for general student committee) is the highest representation of the students at the university and is responsible for all subjects and faculties. It consists as a body of various officers who are elected in the student parliament. This is also voted on in the university elections. The parliament is supposed to control the AStA, gives it a budget in which all expenditures and incomes of the student body are determined and can change the regulations, which regulate a large part of the committee work. The AStA itself takes care of the operational business. It takes care of the semester tickets, supports the student councils and subject groups with their finances and other concerns, and represents the students in many university committees and working groups. In addition, it offers services such as a rental service for university groups or the promotion of initiatives and organizes social support services such as the semester ticket refund, social counseling or the instant loan for needy students. In

addition to these mandatory tasks, however, the AStA also organizes events and uses public relations to take political positions on behalf of the student body. This year, its departments include the chair, the finance department, the university department, the social department, the external department, the department for political education, the department for climate justice and the department for gender and diversity. In addition to the elected officers, there are also many administrative staff working for the university, for example, to organize public relations or first semester support.

The academic self-administration

In addition to the committees and organizational levels just mentioned, there are also counterparts in which not only student representatives sit, but also representatives of the other status groups, i.e. professors, academic mid-level staff and employees from technology and administration. These committees are also important and should create a balance of interests between the groups on common issues. The bodies are the faculty council for each faculty and the senate for the university as a whole. Here, examination regulations are decided, large amounts of money are distributed and important persons, such as the deans or the president, are elected. Both also have commissions on various topics, such as examination issues or sustainability, in which decisions are prepared and whose members are appointed by the representatives in the main body. Unfortunately, with a few exceptions, the group of professors is represented with an absolute majority in the academic bodies and their commissions, as they are granted the corresponding number of seats by law. We find this undemocratic and would like to change it. The student senators and faculty councils are also elected by you in the university elections.

The AStA

Chair

The AStA chairperson represents the entire student body internally (within the university) and externally (to the press, city, state, etc.). The primary task is also to coordinate the work of the individual departments and those subject areas that cannot be assigned to any other department. Finance Department

The Finance Department is responsible for drawing up and implementing the student body's budget and monitors the financial affairs of student self-administration. It processes applications for financial support and reimburses travel and accommodation costs. It also manages the mobility and cultural semester ticket, including contract negotiations and invoicing. The work of the Finance Department is regularly monitored by the Student Parliament.

Internal Affairs

In the department of Internal Affairs, we are your contact persons for questions about examinations, studies or problems with lecturers. The University Office supports student councils and student groups in their work and is in contact with the university and student representatives in the academic self-administration committees. In this way, we want to help you achieve better study conditions, a better campus infrastructure and greater opportunities for student participation. @asta.uni-goettingen.de

Social Affairs

In the Department of Social Affairs, we deal with topics such as student financing, mental health, and the compatibility of study and care work or parenting duties. Our specific tasks include the semester ticket refund and our open peer-to-peer consultation once or twice a week - the social counselling. Currently, the social counselling takes place Wednesdays between 15 and 17 h.

External Relations

The External Relations Department works on the topics of internationalization and networking and is the first point of contact for international students in the AStA. This department is also responsible for the AStA's public relations work. Networking work here means that we get in touch with student representatives from other universities, universities abroad, but also Göttingen initiatives, exchange information on specific topics and work together. Internationals can make an appointment by email to get our 100€ interest free loan.

Gender and Diversity

The Gender and Diversity Unit deals with the range of topics relating to the gender system, gender identity, intersectional feminism and discrimination. It also covers other dimensions of diversity, such as sexual orientation and disabilities/chronic illnesses. We also want to create safer spaces where students can feel comfortable and socialise.

Department for climate justice

Concurrently we organize different kinds of events for the student body. They reach from talks about nature conservation in politics up to space for connection and creativity.

In the Department of Political Education, we work together as a team to discuss topics that we consider important for the current political situation. The university as a place of education always has a political character, which we try to promote by planning workshops, lectures and exchange programs. There is currently an "Anti-fascism and anti-classism" unit, which deals with fascism and class politics. The unit is currently also focusing on this topic.

Emmy-Noether



Emmy Noether was a German mathematician who was the first woman in Germany to earn a habilitation in mathematics. She was born in 1882 and grew up in a Jewish family in Erlangen.

After women were admitted to Bavarian universities starting in 1903, she was able to study mathematics there and earn her doctorate. She was therefore the second German to receive a doctorate in mathematics from a German university. In 1915, she applied for her habilitation at the then world center for mathematics, in Göttingen.

There were controversial debates about this in her faculty, with many opposing women's habilitation on principle. The mathematician David Hilbert's statement that "a university is not a bathing establishment" became famous. Her application was rejected by the Prussian minister, so that she had to hold her lectures under David Hilbert's name.

After the First World War and the collapse of

the German Empire, women were given better legal status, so that in 1919 Emmy Noether became the first woman in Germany to receive a habilitation in mathematics. She was also the first woman in Germany to receive a (non-civil servant) professorship. Her associate professorship, however, did not receive its first paid teaching assignment until 1922 and 1923. She never received a full professorship. Under the Nazi regime, her teaching license was revoked in 1933 because she was Jewish, and she was forced to emigrate to the United States. In 1935 she died there of a tumor. Emmy Noether made significant contributions to mathematics and theoretical physics. She is considered a co-founder of modern algebra, and several theorems and Noether's ring are named after her.

Through her contributions to science and her significant role in the field of women's studies, with her habilitation at the University of Göttingen, Emmy Noether would be a good name-giver for our university. In comparison, a monarch like Georg August, who merely used the money of his citizens to establish a rival university to the Prussian University of Halle, seems outdated.

Naming it Emmy Noether University would make Göttingen the first university in Germany named after a woman. Honoring her for her outstanding achievements and honoring the accomplishments women have made in the past despite barriers should be in everyone's interest.

On the one hand actively by trained persons who pay attention to an aware atmosphere, on the other hand passively by always being available for you. You can also contribute to creating more awareness! Don't give discrimination, isms and assaultive behavior a chance! Help to create safe spaces where everyone can feel comfortable!

pay attention to your surroundings and try not to endanger anyone. Even if the start of your studies is important, you still have to comply with the requirements.

do not be afraid to ask questions. The planners of the O-Phase are available for questions and problems of all kinds at any time. They can help you with a wide variety of concerns.

Respect the boundaries of others and create an atmosphere in which it is easy for others to show their boundaries. Also, state your boundaries so that others can more easily recognize them.

you should be able to have fun in the O phase on your own terms. No means no and only yes means yes, this is not an invitation for discussion. Listen to yourself.

State your preferred name and pronouns in the groups. No one can assume gender from appearance.

5

During the O-Phase you should find a wide range of events, if not in your subject, then for example in the Alternative O-Phase (more information on this can be found in the digital Erstibeutel).

6

Code of Conduct

O-Phase is intended to be an event for everyone. It gives you the opportunity to settle into your studies and form new, hopefully long-lasting friendships and relationships. To make O-Phase as enjoyable as possible for you, we have created a Code of Conduct. If you notice that it is being violated during your O-Phase, you can contact the O-Phase teams. The code is as follows:

The O-Phase teams are there for you. Contact them if you notice unpleasant or problematic behavior.

you don't have to do anything you don't want to do. You are free to decide what you want to do and what you don't want to do.

alcohol is not a duty at the university. If it fits in with the events, you can drink, but behave responsibly - towards yourself and above all towards others. If something unpleasant happens to you during the O-Phase, you can always talk to the organizers. The vast majority of things should be resolved through conversation. Otherwise, you can always turn to the various counseling centers at the university.

Deutschland- semesterticket

The semester ticket is purchased by all students as a **solidarity ticket**. This means that everyone has to buy it, but it only costs 60% of the actual price. That is **€29.40 per month** this semester. You have already paid this amount **for all 6 months** of the semester with the semester fee. Under various circumstances, you can have this amount refunded. You can find information about this on our website.

Like a normal Deutschlandticket, the ticket is valid on all public transport in Germany. It is usually **offered digitally**. This means you can display it on your cell phone. You can see how to do this on the next page. You can find the **link to the ticket portal** on our website or in the email you received at your university email address. Please note that you **must first request your access data for the university IT** to retrieve the ticket. You can

request your account (if you don't already have it) via the QR code below. If you have any further questions or problems, please have a look at our website.

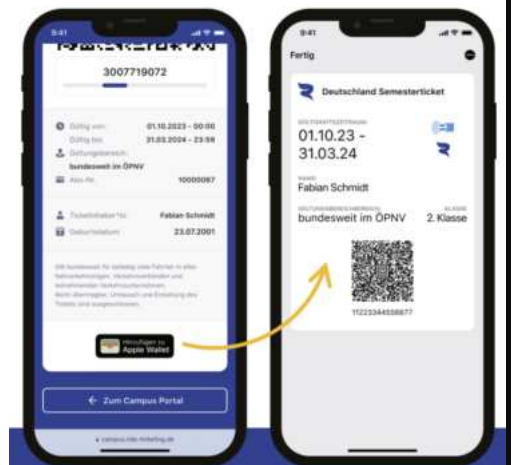
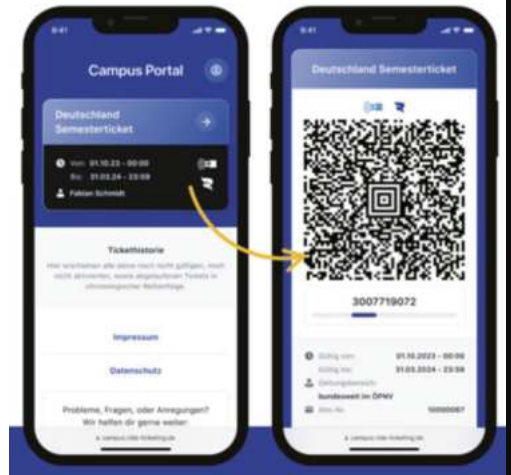
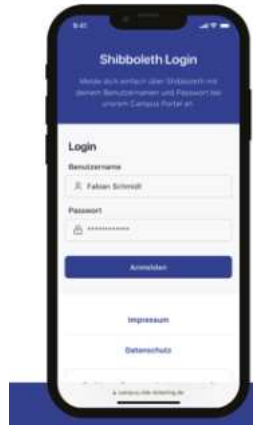

SAISONAL RECIPES

Broccoli soup

- 100g potatoes (June- October)
- 500g broccoli (June- November)
- 5 onions (July- October)
- 250ml oat cream
- Salt, pepper and nutmeg



Cut the onions and braise them lightly. Meanwhile cook broccoli and potatoes. When they are soft, strain off almost all of the water. Blend everything and add the oat cream. Now you can serve the soup with the onions

Tip: onions and potatoes are keepable, therefore you can buy them over the whole year

Tip: salad, cucumbers and tomatoes are during July and September also in season. So you can eat a salad with the soup

SAISONAL RECIPES

Lentil stew

- 100g lentils
- 1 garlic clove
- 1 onion (July- October)
- 250g potatoes (June- October)
- 150g carrots (July- November)
- 1 bunch of parsley (Mai-Oktober)
- Oil to fry
- Broth



Braise onion and garlic. Then add cutted potatoes, carrot and parsley together with the lentils. Cook with broth until everything is done.

Tip: This recipe can be made seasonal over the whole year, because onion, potatoes and garlic are in-stock.

Ramson bread

- 350g flour
- 200ml water
- 1 package of yeast
- ½ tbsp. salt
- 3 tbsp. Oil
- 60g margarine
- ramson



Make a dough with all ingredients instead of margarine and ramson. Roll the dough, coat it with margarine and salt it. Then put the cutted ramson on. Cut the dough in rectangles and fill a cake tin with it. Prove the dough for around 20 minutes and then bake it at 200°C for 30 minutes.

Tip: The season of ramson is from around march to may. Outside of nature conservation areas you can collect it in the forest of Göttingen. It is allowed to collect the amount for a common household.a

Universities are cornerstones of our society and hotspots for academic teaching and research. However, despite their enormous importance, many universities are underfunded. There is a lack of money everywhere. Small degree courses are threatened with closure, the student union has had to increase cafeteria prices and semester fees, and working conditions at the university are precarious.

We are therefore calling for the state to provide significantly more money for universities and student services. There must be enough money for teaching and learning

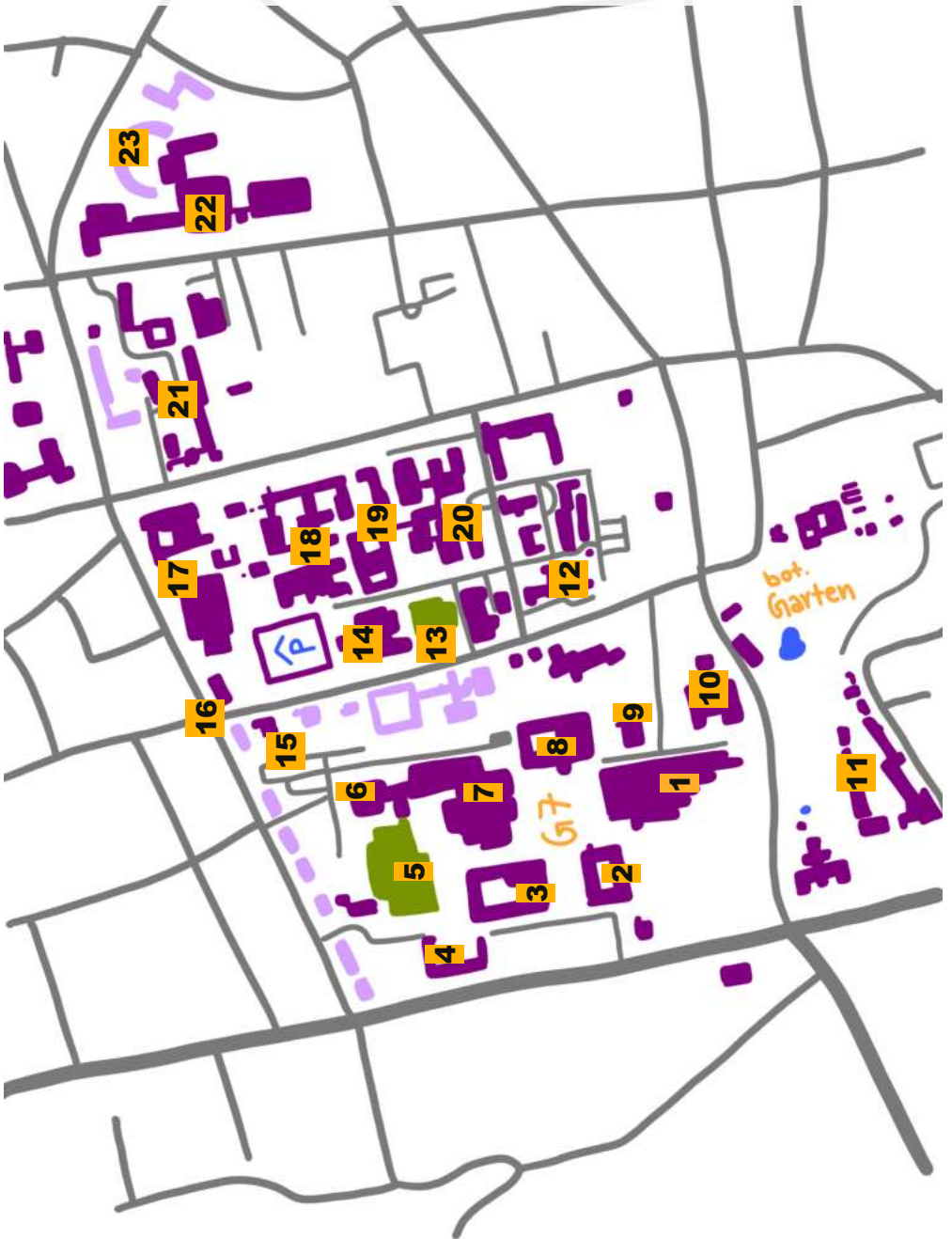

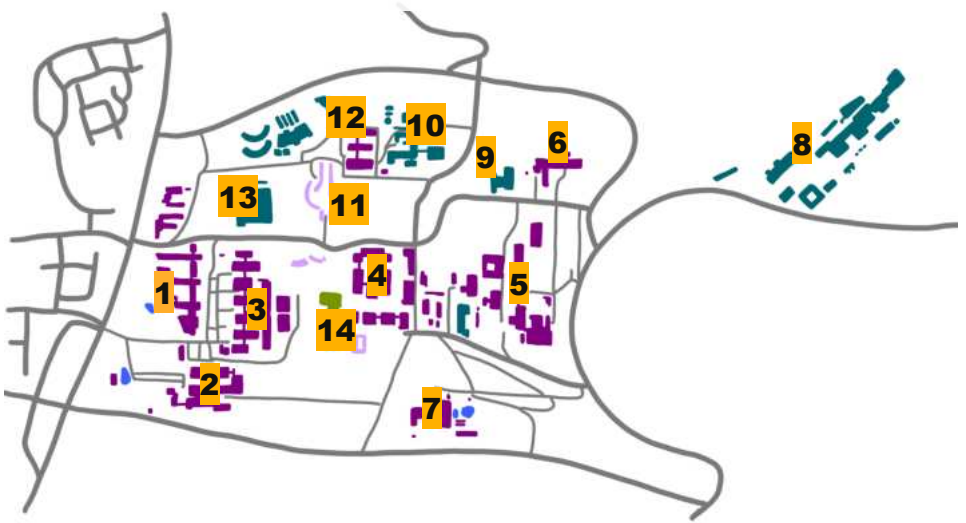

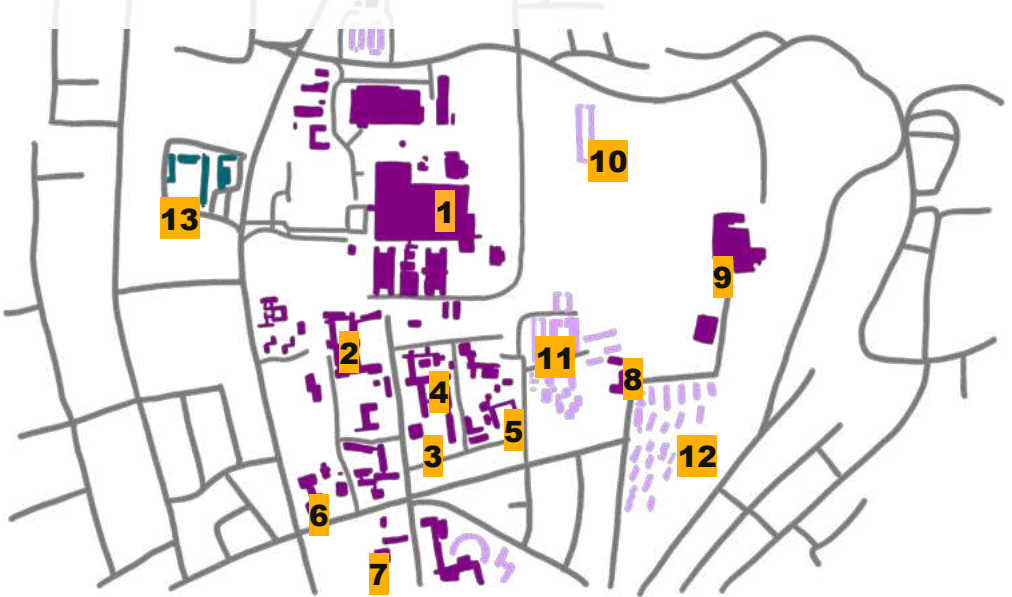

What are knockout drops?

Knockout drops include various substances that are intended to make a person compliant and/or knock them out. These include, for example, GHB (gamma hydroxybutyric acid) and GBL (gamma hydroxybutyrolactone) or liquid ecstasy.

How do knockout drops work?

The effect can occur within a very short time (10-20 min.). Depending on the substance, the effect can last up to several hours. K.O. drops can cause a feeling of euphoria, stimulation, and sexual arousal. It is also often described as a feeling "of being drunk very quickly." If the dose is too high, this leads to dizziness, lightheadedness, nausea, vomiting, sweating, and lack of willpower. Furthermore, a limited ability to move can be added, up to shortness of breath and unconsciousness.

What do knockout drops look like? Can I smell or taste them?

K.O. drops are a colorless powder or liquid. The taste is salty to soapy. However, especially with other mixed drinks like sweet cocktails, this no longer stands out. Likewise, they are odorless.

How can you reduce the knockout drop risks?

Be attentive, keep an eye on your drink and don't leave it unattended. Pick up your drink at the bar yourself and do not accept open drinks from strangers. A hand on the glass, can possibly prevent a pour. Have trusted people watch your drinks. Watch out for each other.

What to do if you suspect a knockout?

Think someone may have given you knockout drops? Inform your friends, trusted persons, the awareness team or other organizers of the O-Phase. No matter who you tell, the most important thing is that you tell them what you suspect. Furthermore, an ambulance should be called or they should go to the hospital with accompanying persons. The police should also be informed. In any case, always have a person around you who supports you and is there for you.

Do you have suspicions about another person?

Ask the person how they are, if they are okay, if everything is okay, if they need anything. Also tell the awareness people, then they can also keep an eye on the person and accompany them. If you are unsure, it is better to call the ambulance once too often than too little. If you find a person unconscious, you should dial 112 immediately!



Studiwerk

The Studierendenwerk Göttingen is your point of contact for professional and social support around your studies. In addition to three canteens and eight cafés with affordable lunches, snacks and coffee, the Studierendenwerk also runs halls of residence, counseling centers and six daycare centers.

There is also a cultural office where you can take part in various workshops, courses and events.

You can find more information about the counseling services on the following pages.

You can often live more cheaply in halls of residence than on the open market. The various halls of residence offer you different options, such as single rooms in a shared hall, rooms in a shared flat or double apartments. You can apply for a room online via the Studierendenwerk website. Due to the high

demand and long waiting lists, it is advisable to apply as early as possible. You can do this when you apply to study, you only need to present a certificate of enrollment when you move in. In addition, an application is always non-binding, so there is no harm in deciding on something else after all.

Good to know: If you are seriously ill or severely disabled, you can apply for preferential admission - you can find information on this in the FAQ of the Studierendenwerk.

International students must contact the Accommodation Service of Göttingen International for accommodation requests and not the Studierendenwerk directly.

Ersti-Tips :)

- If there is **vegan schnitzel**, go to the canteen early
- The cutlery must sometimes be on and sometimes next to the plate, **pay attention** to the markings above the crockery tray
- With your own 0.2 reusable cup, the **coffee in the cafés is cheaper**
- There is a quiet room downstairs in the disposal building where you can **chill out**
- You can get numerous **software licenses** from the GWDG
- You can **organize and network** among students in university groups

Study financing

There are various ways to finance your studies. In addition to BAföG, part-time jobs and scholarships, which most students are familiar with, there is also the possibility of taking out loans and credits at particularly favorable conditions.

The AStA also tries to support you as best it can in financial emergencies. In addition to our interest-free instant loan, you can have the cost of your bus and train semester tickets reimbursed by LeMSHO under certain conditions.

BAföG is a grant that consists of half a loan and half a subsidy (does not have to be repaid). A BAföG application can be submitted to Studiwerk Göttingen at any time. The entire approval period depends on the standard period of study, i.e. usually 6 semesters in the BA and 4 in the MA. While you are receiving Bafög, you can also supplement your income with a mini-job without any deductions.

In Göttingen, there are many opportunities to work alongside your studies, which can be found via the **university's job portal**, for example.

One popular option is to work as a student assistant at the university. This allows you to earn some money, gain exciting insights into research and work directly on campus. Vacancies are advertised on the websites of the faculties and the university or via ecampus.

Scholarships offer another way of financing studies, which are offered by various sponsors from political parties, religious communities, private foundations and the private sector. In addition to the large organizations for the promotion of gifted students, which are mainly financed by the state, there are many other scholarships from mostly private sponsors that offer very different types of funding.

Educational loans for students are offered by the German government-owned Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau (KfW). This is the most cost-effective loan for students. But beware! Student unions are currently warning against taking out such a loan. The reason for this is the high interest rates, which can lead to serious over-indebtedness.

The Studiwerk's social service offers you various options for financing your studies and other possibilities for concessions in the event of financial hardship. A special offer from Studiwerk is the graduation loan. The best way to find out which offer is right for you is to contact the social services office directly. Students are only eligible for housing benefit if they are "basically" not entitled to BAföG but are entitled to financial support. This is the case for very few, which is why an application for housing benefit is usually not promising.

Consulting services

Even if it sometimes feels like it, you are not alone with your problems in student life. However, the right offers of help are often somewhat hidden. We would therefore like to take this opportunity to introduce you to a few options that could help you sooner or later. You can find a detailed list on the website of our social department.

The AStA offers peer-to-peer trans* counseling.

This means that we advise trans* people, especially students and employees of the University of Göttingen, as well as their relatives on the topic of trans*gender. Peer-to-peer means that the person giving advice is trans* themselves. We are happy to help you, for example, with a name change at university or other problems that could make your start at university more difficult.

The advice can be university-specific, but can also cover all other aspects of being trans*. Cover. Counseling can be provided in German or English. If wish, you can also remain anonymous.

Our counseling services include:

- Compatibility of studies and transition
- Support in communicating the transition with the university structures (e.g. name change)
- Help and mediation after experiences of exclusion or discrimination (at the university)

- Guidance with questions about your own gender
- Empowerment through counseling
- Information on the topic of transition (social, legal and medical)

We will also be happy to refer you to other services (doctors, other counseling services, etc.) or help you to find the right contact person for you.

for you. We offer counseling by appointment, either online, on the phone or in person. Unfortunately, the Gender and Diversity Office in the AStA building can only be reached via a staircase (with a stairlift), but personal consultations can also take place in another, barrier-free location. To make an appointment, please contact us by e-mail.

Zentrale Studienberatung (ZSB)

The ZSB is the right place to go if you have any questions about study regulations, examination requirements or other issues relating to your academic education. If you have subject-specific problems, you should also look for the student advisory service at your faculty. The ZSB and other university contact points are complemented by the "InfoLine", which will help you navigate your concerns.

AStA social counseling

We offer advice "by students, for students" - we listen, talk to you and help as best we can.

We are also happy to refer you to the right professional address - because we are not. We are happy to help you get in touch with the institutions listed below or others!

Advice center for anti-discrimination

Established for the winter semester 2024/25, this is a central point of contact for students who have experienced discrimination or other forms of personal misanthropy at the university. In such cases, the counseling service will provide you with individual support and help you find further solutions.

Social Services of the Studierendenwerk

This institution offers a particularly wide range of services, from individual advice to specific grants. This includes, for example, the "Freitisch", which entitles students to free meals in the canteens if they have financial need.

Psychotherapeutic outpatient clinic for students (PAS) and psychosocial counseling center (PSB)

For initial psychological consultations, short-term outpatient therapies and various group offers, students are best advised to visit one of these centers. Professional counseling and support when looking for a therapy place offer elementary assistance. If possible, contact both counseling services, as you will usually be put on the waiting list first.

Family Service

Like the anti-discrimination advice center, the university's family service is also located in the Equal Opportunities and Diversity Office, directly opposite Turmmensa. If you have any questions or need support, students who look after children alongside their studies and/or do other care work, e.g. looking after or caring for relatives, are welcome.

Legal advice

The AStA Secretariat arranges free consultations with a lawyer who can provide an initial professional assessment of legal issues. A comparable service is provided by the Student Legal Advice Service at the Chair of Public Law at the Faculty of Law or the legal advice service of the Göttinger Tafel.

Libraries

The university libraries are the first port of call for research and other work with specialised literature. But they are also ideal for studying as well as preparation and follow-up work. Here is an overview of the university's libraries and study buildings:

SUB Central Library (directly on the central campus, Platz der Göttinger Sieben 1)

The SUB Central Library is the heart of the student infrastructure. Here you will find:

- a comprehensive collection of specialist literature (books, journals, etc.) and other media on a wide range of subject areas (see SUB online catalogue)
- Various workstations (also with PC)
- Group study rooms and individual work booths that can be booked free of charge
- Digital learning infrastructure ('Digital Creative Space')
- Printing, copying or scanning facilities
- 'Quiet room'
- Parent-child workroom

=> Conclusion: The Central Library offers a wide range of options for working. Whether it's individual or group work, research or learning, you'll find everything you need here.

Departmental libraries

In addition to the Central Library, there are a number of specialised departmental libraries that offer a wider range of research and study literature. It is particularly worth using the specialised areas for term papers and final theses or exam preparation.

Agricultural sciences

There are various (institute) libraries for agricultural sciences, depending on the subject area. Further information on opening hours and addresses can be found on the SUB website under the locations.

Biology/Psychology

For psychology and biology, there are different (institute) libraries depending on the subject area. Further information on opening hours and addresses can be found on the SUB website under locations.

For psychology, the Georg-Elias-Müller-Institut on Waldweg is particularly worth mentioning

Chemistry

The specific institute libraries for Chemistry are located on the North Campus of the University at Tammannstraße 2, 4, and 6.

Forest Sciences and Forest Economics

The Institute Libraries of Forest Sciences and Forest Economics are located on the North Campus at Büsgenweg 2-5.

Geosciences and Geography

The Faculty Library of Geosciences and Geography is located at the North Campus in Goldschmidtstraße 5. The map collection is located in Goldschmidtstraße 3 and the museum in 1-5.

Mathematics and Computer Science

The Institute of Mathematics is located at Bunsenstraße 3-5 south of Göttingen city centre.

The Institute of Computer Science is located at Goldschmidtstraße 7 on the North Campus.

Medicine

The UMG's medical libraries are distributed throughout Göttingen depending on the department. One example is the Departmental Library of Medicine at Robert-Koch-Straße 40, which offers a comprehensive range of literature as well as explicit (group) workstations.

Faculty of Philosophy

One example is the Departmental Library of Cultural Studies at Heinrich-Düker-Weg 14. There are 22 libraries of various disciplines of the Faculty of Arts and Humanities here. There are also some group and individual workstations available here.

Physics

The Physics Departmental Library is located at Friedrich-Hund-Platz 1 on the North Campus. Various workstations are also available here depending on requirements.

Law

Specifically for law, there is the library in the Juridicum on the Z-Campus, the library for public and criminal law on the third floor of the so called blue tower on the Z-Campus as well as the library for international and European law on the 12th floor. In addition to subject-specific textbooks, commentaries, and journals, workstations as well as printing/copying and scanning facilities are available here.

Tip: The subject-specific law libraries are characterised above all by the fact that they are very quiet and 'disturbances' are rarely seen or heard. If you don't like this atmosphere, we recommend studying in the central library.

Social sciences and economics

The Departmental Library for Social Sciences and Economics with specialised literature and various workstations is located in the Oeconomicum directly at the Z-Campus on the Platz der Göttinger Sieben.

Theology

For theology, the United Theological Seminars in the Theologicum on the Z-Campus are available as learning and study rooms.

studying areas

In addition to the workstations in the university libraries, there are other study areas available.

LSG

In the Learning and Study Building on the Central Campus there are bookable study rooms for individuals and groups. Some of these are equipped with PCs, whiteboards and monitors.

From concentrated work in a noise-protected atmosphere to interactive work in study groups or as a meeting place for university groups, the LSG offers a wide range of possibilities.

Tip: Due to the high demand, it is advisable to book early, especially during exam periods.

Physics study area

For students from the North Campus, the learning areas in Physics are particularly recommended.

Printing/copying/ Scanning

It is possible to print (for a fee) at various locations on the university campuses. Depending on the degree program, students have access to printing credits. In some programs this is not available, while others have no restrictions at all. In the following, we would like to provide you with an overview of the printing process.

There are various ways to use the university printers, but the following are probably the easiest.

on-site at the PC

Some printers are connected to stationary PCs. There you can log in with your university e-mail address and print in the usual way.

from your own end device

It is also possible to print from your own end device. The method varies depending on the operating system. However, it is always important to connect to the university network directly via 'Eduroam' or via a VPN.

Detailed information and instructions for printing from your own device can be found on wiki.student.uni-goettingen.de under 'support' in the 'print' section.

e-mail to print

It is also possible to send the files to be printed to the printer by e-mail. They can then simply be opened on the corresponding devices and printed. There are also detailed instructions for this on the website mentioned above.

It should also be noted at this point that the university also provides poster printers for A2-A0 formats.

There are also various document scanners with which, for example, book pages can be digitised and then saved on a USB stick or by e-mail.

If you have any further questions or problems, please refer to the comprehensive information on the university website and in particular on studIT (wiki.student.uni-goettingen.de). There is also an overview of all printer locations.

Online tools

The university offers a wide range of online tools. We would like to briefly summarise and explain the most important ones for you here.

E-Campus:

The e-campus is probably the heart of the university's digital infrastructure. Here is a brief overview of the most important functions.

Firstly, it is possible to access your own Studi-Mail address.

Stud.IP offers the possibility to keep track of your daily study routine. Here you can create your timetable, access your courses including the associated files, and use a planner. There are also several small, useful functions. Under self-service functions, you will find information about the semester fee and your payments, your contact details, and the option to generate any necessary certificates such as the Bafög or enrolment certificate. Important documents such as applications to the examination offices or study offices etc. can be found under Forms. Under other services you can, for example, reserve rooms in the LSG or change the password for your university account.

The most important websites for you as students are linked under Links so that you can find the right place as easily as possible.

Flex-Now:

Flex-Now can also be accessed via the e-campus but is explicitly listed here due to its enormous importance.

The most important function is the (mandatory) exam registration. This should be done in good time because the examination offices are not very lenient. Registration is regularly possible up to three days before the start of the exam, cancellation is possible until 23:59 (!) the day before the exam.

It is also possible to have certificates of achievement issued for the coursework completed so far.

An overview of all your examinations can be found under student data.

Flex-Now is also used for the digital submission of assignments and the like.

In addition, there is a statistics portal with information on completed work (e.g. grade point average)

Important: If you have any questions or uncertainties regarding examinations or credit transfer, please contact the Student Administration Office or the Examination Offices in good time.

Library catalogues

On the SUB website (= sub.uni-goettingen.de) you will find the catalogues of the library contents. Here you can find the locations of books or journals in the SUB locations and access the digitally available publications and media.

This database is a very useful tool, especially for writing term papers.

When the WG room costs 180€, but also your freedom

Finding an affordable room at the beginning of the semester has become increasingly difficult in recent years. Advertisements for rooms in magnificent villas with house community and bar for under 200€ rent seem like a dream in these situations - But what normal WG already consists of exclusively male roommates in large villas?

Student fraternities are often particularly attractive because they present themselves as communities full of security, solidarity and connection. To become part of this community, however, new members must commit to the Lebensbund principle: Even after they leave, they continue to be part of the fraternity as an "old gentleman" and must continue to co-finance active members.

In order to become part of the community, new members must also follow the Comment - the code of conduct - of the fraternity, which

structures life together and provides for regular participation in internal fraternity events, for example. Apart from the fact that the strict and binding integration into the fraternity hardly allows for leisure time and individual development, new "masculinity competitions" are held almost every day. An evening at the pub here does not mean a nice get-together, but compulsory drinking and the pressure to prove drinking resistance. The "beer comment" is enforced by a separate presidium and often includes severe punishments for weaker fraternity members. Similarly, in striking fraternities, mensuration is a special form of fencing designed to prove one's "manliness" by exposing oneself to pain and permanent scars without flinching. At the same time, the fencing of the Mensur also serves as an initiation rite to introduce new members to the fraternity. In this way, their willingness to submit and sacrifice themselves for the community is tested.

In accordance with this outdated image of men, fraternities propagate gender roles from 150 years ago. As a rule, fraternities are male associations. The view that there are only two sexes, which are fundamentally different by nature, is the consensus here. This is not merely about "slightly antiquated" ideas of the roles of men and women; it is about a determined denial of the basic pillars of a society based on equal rights and equality. A discriminatory practice can also be seen in the fact that racist or anti-Semitic attacks and statements repeatedly occur in fraternity spaces.

While such mindsets are not fully developed in all fraternities, they are very common. If you want to know more or need evidence for our statements, we recommend the research of Leon Enrique as well as our reader 'Studentenverbindungen gestern und heute'. We as AStA reject the way of life and the way of thinking of fraternities and therefore actively campaign for more apartments to be kept in public hands and affordable there, so that suspiciously cheap offers are no longer a temptation.

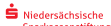
